GAME DAY RULES

Here is how game days go:

- Teams to be set up at the north side of the field. (Where the restrooms are located)
- Games to start on time –
 - Both teams Only have 15 minutes of tolerance, if needed.
 - Games to start on time as soon as both teams have 7 players.
 - Home team to provided 3 game balls.
- Home team to change in case of colors conflict
 - If the away team wants to change, and referees agree, game can be played
- A max of 3 coaches (non-players) on each bench.
 - Players to wear a jersey even if not playing, because of injury.
 - Players/coaches that are suspended can't be on the bench side.
- Ejections - Red Cards
 - If a player and/or coach is ejected, he has to go away, and can only be on the opposite side of the benches, or leave the park.
 - If a player and/or coach do not leave the bench side after an ejection, his team will forfeit the game (2-0 loss), regardless of the score at that moment.; however, if the score is more than 2-0 against his team the score at the moment will stay.
- Teams must have a full uniform, the branding of the gear in each uniform is not to matter, but the colors have to be all the same, including, jersey, shorts and socks.
- If a player, or players do not have a full uniform the referees will ask the team to have the player removed from the field.
- Teams can have up to 24 players in the game day roster.

Teams to move off the benches right after their game finish. –

- Players and coaches, only to be on the bench side when their games are on, and/or before the start of their games.

What not to have on the benches during games –

- Fans to be on the south, east, or west side of the field at all times.
- Alcohol is prohibited at the bench side of the field
- Smoking of any kind is prohibited at the bench side of the field
- If any of those things are seen by the referees, they will ask you to move of the bench side
- If anyone is asked by the referees and/or board member to move off the bench side, and don't comply, referees can finish the game if they feel is the best for the safety of everyone.

The referees have been updated on what things can and can't happen before, during and after the games. Referees can't monitor what is happening in the benches during the games, so let's help each other here; team managers please inform your players and fans of the rules.

For a forfeit based on breaking the game day rules, 2 things need to happen:

- The team manager submitting the protest must submit the protest on writing to the referees, and the CCSL executive board, which has to be submitted on writing the same day (via e-mail, or hard copy).
- The referees have to send a report on that incident corroborating that in fact the incident happen, if the referees don't corroborate it the protest won't proceed.

Referee Tent -

- Under the Referee tent, only referees, and a max of 2 board members can stay in it at all times during games.
- These board members can/will ask/inform the teams during the games if any of them are breaking a rule, and the teams need to correct right after they are informed.
- If a team or teams do not follow instructions on it after been informed the board members can inform the referees, and the game can be stopped, if need.

Let's all help! The league belongs to all of us, Team owners, Players, Coaches, and Fans. If you see one of your fans doing something unappropriated, inform them, that is all we can do, and if we all do our part, we will continue to have the best Amateur Soccer League in Northern California.
